Memory Verse: When I am afraid, I will trust in You. Psalm 56:3

Ideas to Live It Out:

- Learn the song: *Hide em In Your Heart Psalm 56* by Steve Green (Youtube)
- Listen and Learn the Song: *Isaiah 41:10* by Seeds Family Worship (Youtube)
- Make a sign with the memory verse written on it. Be creative, use paint, stickers or whatever you have on hand. When finished, put the sign in your child's room or somewhere it can be seen often. Quote the verse multiple times a day and encourage your child to quote it with you or for you.
- Make motions for your verse to help you learn it easier.
- No Fear Hopscotch: Draw a hopscotch game on your driveway. Write the word FEAR on a rock or beanbag. This will be tossed to a square on the hopscotch for children to play the game. Children are not allowed to hop on the square where the FEAR ROCK has landed. We don't have to be fearful because Jesus is with us.
