This packet will provide the information you need to help prepare yourself or students for the ultimate leadership journey.

FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW:

1. We want to take care of you.

Call or email us anytime! We have worked over 18 months to prepare for your arrival. In fact, here is what we have included in your tuition:

- Three nights in a business hotel
- All of your meals from dinner day 1 to lunch day 4
- Exclusive behind the scenes access to SeaWorld
- Admission to Universal Studios/Islands of Adventure
- Conference Materials
- Transportation once you check in with SLU at the hotel

2. Complete your registration.

Your online account is your gateway for taking care of registration, payment, and extra details. Keep the following notes in mind:

- Full **payment** is due December 3, 2019.
- Submit your **rooming list** by December 3, 2019. Just [click here](#) to fill out the form. This deadline is important because it ensures hotel room availability for your group. Rooming list submitted after that date cannot be guaranteed to be accommodated.
- Pricing is based on four people to a room. If a submitted rooming list has less than four in a room, an **occupancy charge** will be added to your account within seven business days. This charge is \$103 per empty spot.
- Signed "**Participant Waiver and Info Forms**" must be printed and brought to registration for every student and adult attending the conference. The form for any attendee under the age of 18 requires a parent signature. Click [here](#) to print the form.

3. Maximize your students' experience.

We encourage you to walk with your students through the program and be ready to discuss what they have learned each evening or once they are back home. We will provide opportunities for groups to gather throughout the conference. If you are attending as a single, no worries! We'll provide a special group setting for you, where you will have SLU staff members and other singles to meet and debrief with.

4. Bring the right clothes.

As we train young leaders, we want them to grasp the importance of dressing appropriately for the environment and maintaining an appearance that honors Christ. Please see Frequently Asked Questions for specifics regarding this program and how you can partner with us.

5. Put 201 on your calendar.

Trust us, everyone will have an extraordinary experience at SLU 101 this year. By attending SLU 101 Winter Week, you can attend [SLU 201](#) this July 13-17, 2020, or next summer, July 12-16, 2021. You'll want to register for 201 the day you get back!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are the age requirements for SLU 101?

To attend as a single, a student must be at least 15 years old. To attend with a group, students should be at least 14 years old or a rising 8th grader.

What is the payment schedule and what payment options are available?

A \$100 deposit is due at the time of registration, and the remaining balance is due 45 days before the program begins. Any registration not paid in full by this day will incur a \$25 late fee. You have the following options for registration payments:

1. *Paper Checks*: You can mail these to our office (SLU, PO Box 649, Keller, TX 76244). Checks must be received within ten days of registration.
2. *Electronic Checks*: You can do this through your online account.
3. *Credit Cards*: You can use AMEX, VISA, MC, or Discover. A 3% transaction fee will be added to any credit card payments.

What is the cancellation and transfer policy for SLU 101?

Cancellation Policy:

- **45 Days or More Before the Conference:** *Deposit will be lost. (Deposit may be transferred to a new attendee for the current year and same program but cannot be transferred to anyone currently registered.)*
- **30-44 Days Before the Conference:** *50% of the total cost of the program will be forfeited.*
- **Less than 30 Days Before the Conference:** *100% of the total cost of the program will be forfeited.*

Transfer Policy: (You may replace current attendee with a new attendee for the same program)

- **15 Days or More Before the Conference:** No transfer fee.
- **Less than 15 Days Before the Conference:** Transfers will incur a \$10 fee.

What is the difference between a group/family vs. Singles/individuals at SLU 101?

- A **group/family** means there is at least one adult chaperone attending the conference with a student.
- **Singles/Individuals** are students attending without an adult. These students will be assigned a SLU team member who serves as their chaperone for the week.

What about travel protection for SLU 101?

We strongly recommend that you purchase trip protection as SLU prepays all hotels, meals, transportation, etc., 30 to 120 days before the conference. Therefore, we cannot pass a refund on to you other than as noted on the registration page. [Click here](#) for more information on travel protection. Travel protection must be purchased through the portal before the final payment deadline for the trip or before you make the final payment for the trip (whichever date comes first); you cannot add it after this date.

I am driving to SLU 101. Do I need to pay for parking?

Self-parking is \$22 per night for SLU participants. You should plan on parking your vehicle and not using it until the last SLU session is completed.

I am flying to SLU 101. Is transportation provided to/from the airport?

- **Groups/families** are responsible for their own transportation between the airport and the hotel. Once you arrive at the hotel, transportation to/from the parks is included with the conference registration.
- **For singles/individuals**, a SLU team member will meet students at baggage claim areas for the respective airlines on which they are flying. For this purpose, flight information must be submitted to SLU by the deadline. Due to TSA regulations, we are unable to meet students at the gate. We are not able to accept unaccompanied minors flying on any airline. Students will be put on a commercial shuttle service or a taxi with other program participants and will be transported to the program hotel. At the end of the week at approximately 1:00pm, students will be put on a commercial shuttle service or a taxi with other program participants and transported back to the airport.

What should I bring to SLU 101?

Bring your Bible & pen, personal hygiene items, clothes (see Dress Code), reusable water bottle, money (you may want to bring spending money for the merch table, snacks, souvenirs, etc.). It is often cold in the conference room, so you may want to pack a sweatshirt/light jacket for sessions.

What if I have dietary restrictions or food allergies?

If you have special dietary restrictions or food allergies, they should be submitted to SLU no later than 45 days before the program begins. [Click here](#) to submit dietary needs. If something comes up after registration, you can update your registration information up to 15 days before the program begins. Please be sure to offer specifics on what you cannot eat and what can be substituted. We will make every effort to accommodate, but there may be certain times when this is not possible. We strongly recommend that you also bring prepared foods or snacks with you that are compliant with your dietary needs. Food allergy tickets will be placed in your registration packets for you to give to hotel staff at all meals in order for them to serve you at every meal.

What do I do when I arrive at the hotel on day one of SLU 101?

Registration begins at 1:00pm-3:45pm on Day One. You will check in at the SLU table to pick up both your room keys (if room is available) and conference materials. You will need to print and bring a signed "Participant Waiver and Info Form" to registration for every student and adult attending the conference. The form for any attendee under the age of 18 requires a parent/guardian signature. (Click [here](#) to print the form or find online under "Important Documents" in your account.) Please note that hotel rooms do not begin to be available until after 3:00pm.

Do I need to bring a medical release form?

- **Groups:** Group leaders must bring a medical release form for any minors attending without a parent/guardian and keep those forms with you at all times during the program. Medical release forms must empower your group leader (not SLU) to authorize medical treatment for the students you are bringing to the program.
- **Singles:** Any student attending without a chaperone must complete the SLU Medical Release Form during the online registration process.

How are students roomed together at SLU 101?

As part of the registration process, you must submit a rooming list no later than 45 days before the program.

Singles/Individuals:

SLU will automatically place you in a room with up to three other student attendees of the same gender based on the following guidelines:

- Rooms may not be co-ed unless both attendees are members of the same family.
- One individual student under 18 cannot be in a room by themselves.
- SLU will not room an under-18 student with anyone over 18 if they are not from the same group.

Groups:

- Tuition rates are based on four people sharing a room. If you are unable to fill a room completely, you may request that SLU fill those empty spots with another student(s). If SLU is unable to fill the room, additional charges will apply (\$103 per empty spot). You may be billed for this after the final payment date, as necessary.
- Rollaway beds are not available.

Can an adult with my group stay in the hotel but not attend the conference?

Sure! On the rooming list, make sure you include their name(s) and that they are not attending the conference. We will charge a \$103 fee to cover that hotel stay. If all four spots in a room are not filled, you will also be responsible for an additional \$103 fee per empty spot. Please note that to qualify for the group rate, at least one adult per group must be a participating attendee.

What is the dress code for SLU 101?

As we train young leaders, we want them to grasp the importance of dressing appropriately for the environment and maintaining an appearance that honors Christ and exemplifies the “Look of a Leader”. Thus, we have established a few guidelines for SLU 101:

- Shirts should fully cover the front, back and sides. Any sleeveless shirts should have a strap that is at least “3 inches” wide. No spaghetti straps, racerback tops or tanks with oversized arm holes should be worn.
- All shorts (including athletic shorts) should have a 7-inch inseam. Additionally, skirts and dresses should be no more than 4 inches from the knee. Leggings should not be worn unless they are worn with a covering that adheres to the above guidelines.
- Below we have included examples of what this looks like:



The dress code applies to all parts of the conference experience - sessions, meals, park time, free time etc.- and applies to both students and adult leaders. If anyone chooses to dress outside of these guidelines, he/she will be asked to change. If you have any questions about this feel free to reach out!

Why is there a dress code at SLU?

SLU strives to set students up in such a way that they will have the confidence and wisdom to walk into any room and be prepared for whatever is before them. We believe that how you present yourself is a vital part in that. The dress code is not meant to put a negative light on the students' experience but to help train each one of them on the importance of dressing modestly and appropriately in any situation.

Who enforces the dress code?

By attending our conference, you are partnering with our organization. We ask that in this partnership, you ask your students to abide by the guidelines we have set in place to make this the best possible experience for them. It will be much better to set your students up well by informing them of the dress code ahead of time and being sure they abide by it while at the conference.
